Appointment of Kenneth Q. Burchill as personnel director of Chevrolet Motor Division's Gear & Axle and Forge plants was announced today by Richard C. Walter, manager.

Burchill, of Livonia, who has been administrator of divisional labor relations at Chevrolet Central Office, succeeds Douglas C. Mullen, who was appointed personnel director of Chevrolet-Flint Manufacturing.

The new Gear & Axle and Forge personnel director joined Chevrolet in 1958 as a supervisor of the division's Spring & Bumper plant at Livonia. He became a conference leader there in 1957, supervisor of salaried personnel administration in 1958 and supervisor of labor relations in 1960.

The following year Burchill became a divisional labor relations representative at Chevrolet Central Office. He was named administrator of salaried personnel in 1963 and administrator of divisional labor relations in 1964.

He served with the Army for three years during the Korean War, earning the Korean Service Medal with three battle stars, a Bronze Star, commendation ribbon with metal pendant and the Korean and American presidential unit citations. He currently is a captain in the Army Reserves, taking the command and general staff course at the 5033 U.S. Army Reserve School at Livonia. He also is a member of the Varsity Club of Michigan State.

Burchill and his wife, the former Irene A. Hatchegian of Melvindale, and their two sons reside at 15075 Ellen Drive, Livonia.






