Who doesn't look for short cuts in good taste? Here's a fully fold in cherry pie-filling until evenly blended. Spoon into 6 parfait glasses. Light sweetened whipped cream and tart cherry-pie-filling straight from the can. Jiffy Charles "W" Cream (Makes six 1/2-cup servings)

2 teaspoons sugar
