Sound the sad song in September. "Club 1270" folds up its tables for the last time. Sept. 3. The reason? Well, maybe you can figure it out. Generally the blame is on rating reduction but the show is tops in its slot with higher ratings than ever. The fact of the matter lies in the network taking more time than ever from the local stations across the country.

Apparently ABC feels that it can better serve the needs of local communities with such artistic achievements as "OK, Crackerby" or "The Double Life of Henry Phyllis." As a result, no less than four locally-produced programs will be eliminated from the WXVZ program schedules, being replaced with additional network programming.

For "Club 1270" it marks the end of the longest and most successful run of any local dance party type show. Since many of 1962, the program has continued on a weekly basis, featuring such names as Trini Lopez, Brenda Lee, Chuck Berry, the Everly Brothers, the Righteous

Brothers, Connie Francis, Gene Pitney, Chubby Checker, Johnny Rivers, the Beatles, Nancy Wilson, The Rolling Stones, and the list goes on—matching in quality most national network attractions.

But it's over soon and perhaps for the better. Perhaps it may help other, similar programs across the country by proving with its absence that there is a market for good local programming.

Speaking of the networks, the pressure increase for movie product as the best bet for rewarding ratings seems to be Hollywood's more recent the better. Among the features lined up for this fall's air fare:

"Thurber Carnival" as done in the outdoor Quirk Amphitheater on the Eastern Michigan University Campus was the perfect antidote for a warm summer evening. A capable cast, clever stage settings, and the charming costumes had an infectious quality that made the Ypsilanti night air sing and swing.

Director James Goussell deserves a double accolade for his competent staging of this delightful musical revue... and designing such an attractive set. His concept of the fun-filled "Thurber Carnival" was fresh and had an edge that drew the audience's attention for the full two hours of the show's performance time.

The colorful costumes as planned by Dianna Rose were perfect and eye-catching as they were framed by a basic white and black background. The large Thurber cartoon that festooned the black-white sets were done by Raymond Nichols. Immediately upon entering the pleasant court amphitheater those huge Thurber figures put you into a congenial mood for the show.

Director Goussell had assembled a comic convey of capable actors for this sharp, sophisticated musical revue. Dale Bellaire was the top banana. His facial grimaces, double takes and delayed comic bits stopped the show in most of his sketches. In "Walter Mitty" even Old Wally fell off his seat onto the grassy slope of the amphitheater when Dale rolled his eyes and assumed various facial poses.

Robert MacGonigal did most of the Tom Ewell parts. Tom did the original version. MacGonigal's style does differ greatly from Ewell's. Ewell, however, has a way of working an audience until they are firmly in the palm of his hand. Bob garnered loads of laughs and was outstanding in "Gentleman Shopper."

On the distaff side Cheryl Bellaire, Linda Siglin, Donna Stanton, and Anne-Marie Lowell proved that a comedienne can be beautiful and still wrench laughs out of an audience.
