Lions Plan Essay Event on Peace
 The new Westland Lions Club will join Lions International this fall to sponsor a local essay contest with the topic being "Peace Is Achievable."
 Samuel D. Smith, president of the club, which will receive its charter Saturday night, announced that Westland Mayor Thomas J. Brown, a charter member of the club, will be one of the three judges for the contest. He is open to local persons between the ages of 14 and 22, as of next Jan. 15.
 The grand prize winner in the international contest will receive a \$25,000 personal education and/or career assistance grant, to be administered by the International Association of Lions Clubs.
 Eight winners in various regions will get a \$1,000 cash prize, an expense-paid trip to the Lions International 50th anniversary convention in Chicago next year; a trophy medal; and a plaque.
 On the district and level, winners will be placed from the president of the International Association of Lions Clubs.
 Smith said that further details on the contest, for which the entry deadline is Dec. 16, will be announced in the near future by Lions International.

88th U of D Season Features Commentary
 Four famous playwrights, famous for pointed social commentary, are represented in the University of Detroit's 88th Drama Season, according to Alan Jorgensen, director.
 "Caesar and Cleopatra," George Bernard Shaw's "Cato and Brutus," and "The Merchant of Venice" opens the series and will be presented three Friday-through-Sunday weekends, Oct. 7, 14, and 23. In this play, Shaw recounts the maturing influence of the older, sophisticated conqueror on a kitchy girl who grows into a womanly queen.
 "Brecht on Brecht," a living anthology of the exciting works of Bertolt Brecht, as adapted by George Tabori, includes readings, dramatizations and musical numbers which vividly portray the author's observations on civilization.
 The show will run the weekends of Nov. 11, 18, and 25.
 Henrik Ibsen's "Hedda Gabler," dramatizes a woman's struggle to free herself as an individual from a conforming traditional environment. The play will be presented the weekends of Jan. 27, Feb. 3 and 10.
 Christopher Fry writes in poetry the witty tale of the love of a lovely accused witch and its influence on a disillusioned, returned soldier in "The Lady's Not for Burning." The bubbling comedy will be presented the weekends of March 3, 10, and 17.
