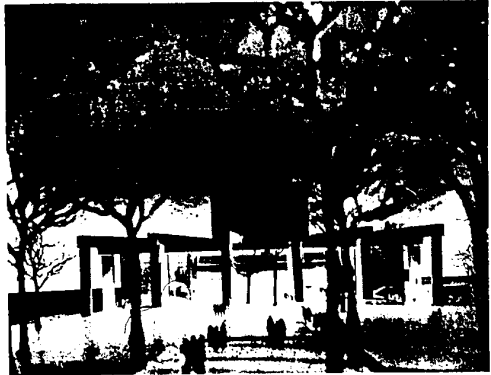

**Detroit Symphony Plans 30 City Tour on Coast**  
The Detroit Symphony Orchestra will visit 30 U.S. cities and perform for the first time on the West Coast during two tours scheduled for the Orchestra's 1966-67 season.  
With conductor Sixten Ehrling, the Orchestra will give 36 concerts in cities from Maine to California.  
Eighteen concerts will be performed in 13 New England cities between Oct. 17 and Nov. 5. The Symphony also will give 18 concerts in 17 western and midwestern cities between Jan. 16 and Feb. 5.  
The New England tour will include performances in Symphony Hall, Boston, and Carnegie Hall, New York, as well as at the week-long Worcester (Massachusetts) Music Festival.

Miss Hayes will be featured in "School For Scandal," "Right You Are," and "We, Comrades Three." Though "the first lady" has a relatively small part (Mrs. Candour) in "Scandal," her incisive portrayal will surely be one of the highlights of the entire production.  
In Pirandello's "Right You Are" and "We, Comrades Three," Miss Hayes has a chance to show the full range of her histrionic abilities by assuming roles calling for the complete range of her legendary talents.  
The Association of Producing Artists (A.P.A.) has just completed a most successful summer booking on the West Coast. The APA for the past few years has divided its performances between Ann Arbor and New York City. The West Coast stand completes a full year of employment for the versatile acting company.  
Too often excellent repertory companies had to limit their engagements when the audience potential in a location will "dry up."  
The Stratford Shakespearean Festival has prolonged their season until Oct. 8. Guthrie Theater now extends its schedule to Dec. 1. The Arena Stage in Washington is a year-round operation. The Cleveland Playhouse has a similar plan.

## Powers' Donation Makes New U-M Theatre Possible

ANN ARBOR—New legitimate theatre at The University of Michigan was announced by University of Michigan President Harlan Hatcher.  
Gifts of stock currently valued at considerably more than \$1,000,000 have been received for the theatre from Mr. and Mrs. Eugene B. Power and their son, Philip Power. Power, a former Regent of the U-M, is chairman of University Microfilms Inc., of Ann Arbor and a director of Xerox Corporation.  
The Power family has had a long-time interest in the theatre, and were among the founders of the Dramatic Arts Center in Ann Arbor in 1954, an early venture in community repertory theatre.  
"We have made this gift out of the strong conviction that it is as important that the modern student have experience with good theatre as with athletics while he is in college," Power commented.  
U-M President Harlan Hatcher said "the new theatre will be a landmark for The University of Michigan, both in terms of its beautiful design and in terms of what it will provide in cultural enrichment for our campus community."  
Members of the steering committee viewed a model of the proposed theatre, to be located in the heart of the University's Central Campus. It will face Felch Park, on Fletcher Street, in the block between Huron and Washington Streets.  
Parking and direct, covered access to the theatre will be provided by the Fletcher Street Parking Structure, now under construction.
