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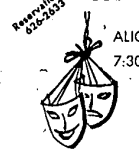


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Student Ins. Deadline Is Fri., Sept. 23

Students in Farmington schools have until Friday, Sept. 23, to enroll in the voluntary group student accident insurance program, according to J. Victor Stockell, president of the Citizens for Farmington Students, Inc.

The insurance program has received the unanimous approval of the Farmington school administration in cooperation with the PTA Council. THE PLAN, OFFERED through G-M Underwriters, Inc., costs \$2 for grades kindergarten through six, and \$2.50 for grades seven through 12. Material explaining the plan was sent home with students last week.

Enrollment is open only once each year and must be made at this time.

Parents wishing to enroll their children should complete the application attached to the brochure and enclose the proper premium in the envelope, preferably by check or money order. Checks should be made payable to G-M Underwriters, Inc.
