**ORDINANCE NO. 26C  
ORDINANCE AMENDING  
WATER SUPPLY AND  
SEWER DISPOSAL  
ORDINANCE**  
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND  
THE WATER SUPPLY AND  
SEWER DISPOSAL ORDINANCE  
OF THE TOWNSHIP OF  
FARMINGTON TO ADD A  
GOVERNING SEWER  
CONSTRUCTION.  
THE TOWNSHIP OF FARM-  
INGTON ORDAINS:  
That Part V of the Water  
Supply and Sewer Disposal  
Ordinance, as amended, of the  
Township of Farmington effective  
February 21, 1960, is  
amended as follows:  
**PART V. WATER MAIN  
AND SEWER CONSTRUCTION**  
1. No water main, sanitary  
sewer or storm sewer which  
shall serve or be designed to  
serve more than one premises  
shall be constructed, recon-  
structed or altered in the Town-  
ship of Farmington unless a  
permit for such construction,  
reconstruction or alteration is  
first procured from the Town-  
ship Building Department.  
2. Application for permit shall  
be accompanied by complete  
plans and specifications which  
shall be submitted to the Town-  
ship Engineer for review and  
approval before such permit is  
issued. Such review will in-  
clude:  
a. Checking water main plans  
for size of mains and adequacy  
of gates and fire hydrants.  
b. Checking sanitary and  
storm sewers to determine  
proper grades with resultant  
self-cleaning velocities.  
c. Determining types of joints  
on the basis of the characteris-  
tics of the particular area.  
d. Determining protection of  
pipe, width of trench and  
strength of pipe by depth of  
sewer and type of soil to be en-  
countered.  
e. Checking sizes to deter-  
mine needs for sanitary sewers  
and run-off capacities for storm  
sewers.  
f. Checking pavement designs  
for type, thickness related to  
local soil, conditions, adequacy  
of drainage and length of gut-  
ter runs between highpoints and  
catch basins and sidewalk  
crossing.  
g. If the plans and specifica-  
tions are approved by the Town-  
ship Engineer, the construction  
permit shall be issued upon  
payment of the fees as hereinaf-  
ter provided. If the Township  
Engineer does not approve the  
plans and specifications he shall  
give his recommendations in  
writing to the Township with a  
copy to the applicant. The ap-  
plicant may amend the plans  
and specifications in accordance  
with said recommendations or  
may appeal the decision of the  
Engineer to the Township Board  
in writing, in which event he  
shall be given a hearing before  
said Board at a regular meet-  
ing within 30 days after notice  
of appeal is received by the  
Township Clerk.  
4. The Township Engineer  
shall cause to be made, all such inspections of  
the project as the work pro-  
gresses as he shall deem nec-  
essary to insure that the sewer  
will be built in accordance with  
the approved plans and speci-  
fications and in accordance with  
all ordinances and regulations  
of the Township or the County  
of Oakland. The Township En-  
gineer shall have the right to  
authorize departures from the  
approved plans and specifica-  
tions where necessary because  
of unforeseen circumstances, but  
no departures from the ap-  
proved plans and specifications  
shall be made without the au-  
thorization of the Township En-  
gineer. If the Township En-  
gineer shall find that the said im-  
provements are not being in-  
stalled or constructed in ac-  
cordance with the aforemen-  
tioned standards, he shall issue  
a written notice of violation re-  
quiring the installation or con-  
struction to be so corrected. In  
said notice the Engineer shall  
specify a time limit for the cor-  
rection of the violations. If the  
violations are not corrected  
within the specified time, the  
Building Inspector may order  
all work stopped or take any  
other legal steps necessary to  
obtain compliance.  
5. A review and permit fee  
equal to 1% of one (1%) per  
cent of the estimated cost of  
the project as determined by  
the Township Engineer shall be  
paid to the Township Treasurer  
at the time an application for  
permit is filed. An estimated  
inspection fee equal to three  
and one-half (3 1/2%) per cent  
of the estimated cost of the  
project as determined by the  
Township Engineer shall be  
paid to the Township Treasurer  
at the time the permit is is-  
sued. The amount of all fees  
shall be adjusted upon the ac-  
tual cost of the project after  
work is completed, and upon a  
final audit of the project.  
This amendatory ordinance  
shall become effective imme-  
diately upon publication in the  
Farmington Enterprise, Farming-  
ton, Michigan. Ordinance No.  
26A is hereby repealed.
