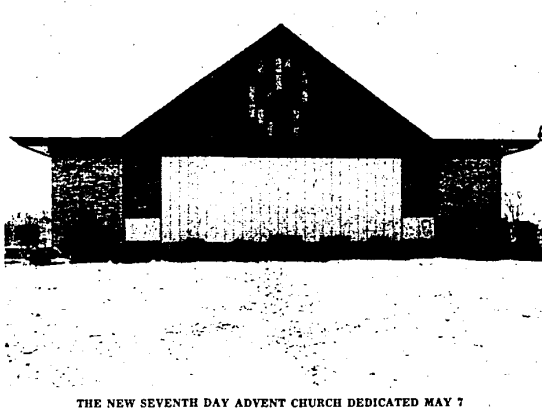

THE NEW SEVENTH DAY ADVENTIST CHURCH DEDICATED MAY 7

Seventh Day Adventist Church is Dedicated

The official opening services were held on Saturday, May 7, for the new Farmington Seventh Day Adventist Church located at 2051 Ten Mile Road. For several years members of the Farmington Seventh Day Adventist Church realized their building was no longer sufficient. When the property was purchased years ago the building growth of an active community was not foreseen. In more recent years the building has become nearly obsolete with parking space no longer available. Neither was there any available land in which to expand to meet their needs.

The building, itself, was not filled to overflowing but it became evident a new edifice was needed to solve various problems such as these. DIFFERENT TIMES the enthusiasm ran high with plans for a new church. The congregation even started their building fund, but somehow not much headway was made. Then about four years ago, Michigan Conference of Seventh Day Adventist appointed Raymond D. Hamstra Pastor of the Church. Things began to happen. Discussion again cited the real need for a proper sanctuary, Dorcas and activities room plus adequate rooms for the children's divisions.

At first it seemed hardly likely that a church body of a little over 100 members could possibly finance such a building, but each one was willing to give of their means and labor as they were able. Soon they began to see the plans unfold as willing hearts and hands raised the new church on Ten Mile.

PASTOR HAMSTRA is a veteran in promoting church development; the people are very happy that he has been sent here to make these dreams a reality. Church dignitaries present at the ceremony were Elder Wilson, Michigan Conference President of Seventh Day Adventist; Elder L. G. Warlick, prayer of dedication; Elder William Hubert, Head of Church Development, gave the sermon; and Ralph Otto, Head Elder of the Church, gave the history of the Church at the ceremony.

Post Office To Promote Mailbox Beautification

Seventeen million postal customers' mailboxes will be the target of Post Office Department nationwide beautification drive next month, Postmaster General Lawrence F. O'Brien said today.

Mailbox Improvement Week will be held May 15 to 21 to promote the best possible appearance for about 10 million mailboxes on rural routes and 7 million others on city residential "curbline" delivery routes, the Postmaster General announced.

More than 1.8 million miles along the nation's highways and byways are dotted with the rural mail receptacles, served by approximately 32,000 rural carriers, Mr. O'Brien noted. "If these boxes look their best, this can be an unusual and beneficial contribution to the natural beautification efforts of the President and the First Lady," Mr. O'Brien observed.

Except for minimal requirements, such as those to make boxes reasonably secure against weather and readily accessible to carriers, mailboxes and the posts on which they stand can be painted and decorated almost as extensively as the boxholder's place.

Mr. O'Brien commented many customers have painted their mail receptacles in decorative colors and provided ornamentation such as ironwork representations of eggs and other animals. Many have
