TO VOTE ON THE FOLLOWING CITY INCORPORATION PROPOSAL: "Shall the following described territory in Oakland County, Michigan, be incorporated as a Home Rule City under the provisions of Act 273 of the Public Acts of 1909, as amended; and, if so, on the following terms: WHEREAS, heretofore on November 8, 1965, pursuant to Act 273 of the Public Acts of 1909, as amended, a petition was filed by certain resident electors and freeholders of the area, praying for the incorporation of the territory described as

Farmington Township, being described and known as "Town 1 North, Range 9 East, Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan", which Township is bounded on the north by the north line of the Township on the East by Inaker Road, on the south by Eight Mile Road (also known as Baseline Road), and on the west by Haggerty Road, including the existing Villages of Quakerstown and Wood Creek Farms but excluding therefrom that part of Farmington Township within the corporate limits of the City of Farmington, as a Home Rule City.

That the form and sufficiency of the petition heretofore filed on November 8, 1965, praying for the submission of the question of incorporation of the City to consist of the territory described in said petition, complies with the provisions of Act 273 of the Public Acts of 1909, as amended; and, if so, in all respects regular; That June 6, 1966, be set as the date for a Special Election on the question of incorporating the City.

A regular meeting of the Council of the City of Farmington was held on May 2, 1966. Meeting called to order at 8:05 p.m. by Mayor Pro-Tem Thayer.

ROLL CALL: Councilmen Allen, Thayer and Yoder present. ABSENT: Brotherton, Peterson. CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: City Manager Dignan, Clerk Kelly, Treasurer Kelly, Acting Chief Deputy and Director DeBane.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: Motion by Allen seconded by Yoder that the minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council held on April 18, 1966, be approved as published. Motion carried, all ayes.

PUBLIC HEARING: REQUEST TO REZONE LOTS 23 AND 24, DAVIS ADDITION AND PORTION OF LOT 7, ASSESSOR'S PLAT NO. 3, FROM R-1 TO R-1-P. Mr. Glenn Coultter, Attorney for the First Methodist Church, submitted a sketch of survey for rezoning of the portion of vacated Third Street which is between Lots 23 and 24, Davis Addition Subdivision.

City Manager Dignan recommended that the City Council authorize the City Manager to receive bids for approximately 30,000 square feet of street repair at an estimated cost of \$4,000.00 utilizing the Bituminous in Place Stabilization with Double Seal Coat Surface. Motion carried, all ayes.

OFF-STREET PARKING FARMINGTON CLEARINGS: Mr. Howard B. Thayer, City Engineer, submitted the off-street parking plan designed by Francis Papke, Inc. for the new service drive and off-street parking to service the merchants along the sidewalk adjacent to Mayfield on the south side of Grand River. He stated that by relocating the existing sidewalk adjacent to the commercial building, it is possible not only to have a wider sidewalk but also angular off-street parking. This plan affords more off-street parking than it was provided for on Grand River and channels the traffic in a safer manner than it was provided for on Grand River.
