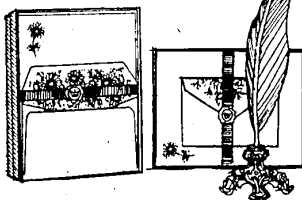

Noted Authority On Twp. Govt. To Speak Here Next Tuesday

The Committee for the Preservation of Farmington Township, Inc., a group leading the opposition to the incorporation of Farmington Township, has announced that one of the country's best-informed authorities on Township government will address the citizens of Farmington Township.

Mr. Joseph A. Parisi Jr., Executive Director of the Michigan Townships Association will talk at a special pre-election meeting on May 24, at 8 p.m. at North Farmington High School, 32900 W. Thirteen Mile Road.

His subject will be "Incorporation — Some Facts, Pro and Con." Parisi's experience in government began in 1928 when he was elected as a Justice of the Peace. In 1951 he was appointed to the position of Kalamazoo Township Clerk. In 1957 he assumed the office which he presently holds. He has served on numerous national, state and local governmental committees, several of which he was appointed to by the President of the United States. His two books on Township Government have sold well over 50,000 copies.

"We're fortunate to get Mr.

Parisi to speak to us," said Mr. Wendell Brown, President of the Committee. "His national reputation has created a terrific demand for his services as a speaker. We're particularly fortunate to get him to speak to us only two weeks before we vote on incorporation. Every voter in our Township owes it to himself to hear what Mr. Parisi has to say."
