Early registration is urged, beginning June 13, at the summer school office, Farmington High School, 32789 Ten Mile Road, from 3 to 6 p.m. No registrations will be accepted after June 22. The summer school session is from June 22 through August 1.

Programs are offered in elementary and secondary courses to residents and non-resident students. A course for driver education is also available. Descriptions and registration information are being distributed by the office of summer school director Richard Tyler. They are available in the district or at the office.

Education is open to residents only. No transportation is provided.

Classes at the elementary level include a math improvement course for grades 4 to 6 meeting for 35 minutes daily from 9:30 a.m. to 10 a.m., 10 a.m. and 11 a.m. at Ten Mile School, 32789 Ten Mile Road.

A series of enrichment classes will also be offered at the elementary level. These include three sessions two of which will last three weeks each, the classes will permit children to participate at times convenient to their families. The third session will meet for the full six weeks. These classes will also meet at Ten Mile School.

Elementary enrichment classes include explorations in math, composition and study skills, beginning Spanish, Intermediate French, French, basketball and science exploration.

Classes at the secondary level will meet at Farmington High School. Parents are to consult with their counselors before registration in order that course credit can be planned. The work of a full semester is concentrated into the summer school session and students are expected to apply themselves accordingly.

Secondary enrichment classes include English in grades 7 through 11; 7th and 8th grade social studies; United States history and world history; 7th and 8th grade general science; and reading improvement.

Mathematics courses offered include 7th and 8th grade mathematics; Algebra and 11; and geometry and trigonometry. A geometry course includes plane geometry. A class for 7th and 8th grade basketball and another for basketball, grades 9 through 12, are planned.

Instrumental music and instrumental music for grades 9 through 12 have been located throughout the school district.
