'Come Blow Your Horn' At F'ton Summer School

Instrumental music classes will be held again this summer as part of the Farmington Public Schools' total summer school curriculum. Students in grades four through grades twelve and beyond may take daily instructional classes on all band and orchestral instruments.

Classes will commence on Tuesday morning, June 21 and continue through Friday, August 5. Classes will be conducted in eleven school centers in the school district, thus helping the participating students to advance instrumentally over the summer months.

Richard Tyler, director of the summer school, stated that classes would be held mornings, Monday through Fridays at Beechview, Cloverdale, Dunckel Junior High, East Junior High, Farmington Junior High, Farmington High, Eagle, Flinders, Highmeadow, Ten Mile, and Wooddale schools.

Registration for summer instrumental classes will take place the week of June 13 at Farmington High School from 3 p.m. until 6 p.m., and on Saturday morning, June 15, from 9 a.m. until 12 noon. Registration forms are available at all Farmington public schools.

In addition to the daily classes, there will be evening trips to hear the Detroit Symphony Orchestra at the State Fair Grounds, and to hear the Detroit City Band at Belle Isle. There will also be summer concert appearances.

Mr. Tyler further urges parents to consider carefully the

importance of their children's continuous study of their instruments this summer in order that they maintain and improve their musical skills. He further stated that if family vacations do not permit attendance for the entire seven week period, that children are still encouraged to participate as often as they can.

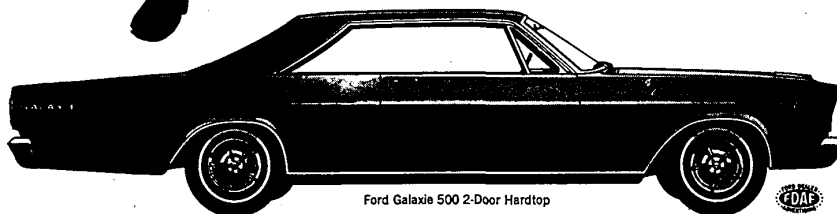
