DAR Tell Story Of Chapter Name

Three Flags Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution will have a picnic and meeting at the home of Mrs. Glen Levey, 2130 Indian Road, Southfield, on Monday, June 15.

With Flag Day on June 14, the chapter prepared a short history of their chapter's name. The French flag flew over Fort Pontchartrain from 1701 to 1763 when Antoine de la Mothe Cadillac built the Fort. The English captured the Fort during the French and Indian War, so the English flag flew from 1763 to 1796.

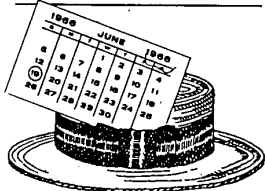

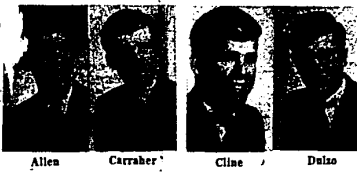

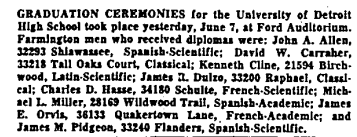
