Mr. and Mrs. Harrison Johnson, 2373 Liberty St., on June 11 celebrated their fifty-ninth wedding anniversary. Harrison was born in Livonia Township and attended the rural school there. His youth was that of a typical farm boy and he was fond of horses.

June 11, 1907 was the date he and Mary Ely were married at the farm of her grandfather, William Ely, a farm of about 200 acres that included the Our Lady of Sorrows property and Belle Isle Subdivision. Mary's home had been what is now known as the Dunrovin Farm on Twelve Mile Road. She was one of six children; William, Carl, Jennie, Imogene and Alma were her brothers and sisters. She attended the West Farmington School and Harry McCracken was one of her early teachers.

After their marriage, their first home was at the Hutton farm at the northeast corner of Grand River and Drake Road. Harrison helped construct some of the big barns that have since been removed.

About 1910, he and Louis Schroeder had an old fashioned general store near the location of the Civic Theatre. He was a conductor on the Detroit Urban Railroad for a time and also helped Arthur Lamb build houses and carried a rural mail route. The mail route was
