

# Junior Legion Team Moves To First In District

Farmington's Junior American Legion team moved into first place in 18th District baseball winning 4 out of 5 contests last week.

After losing Monday, June 27, by a score of 4-3 to Walled Lake, manager Wally Christensen received a fine pitch in efforts and they gave up only one run in the next 4 games.

On Wednesday they defeated Southfield 5 to 1 behind Chuck Viane's 5 hit pitching. Farmington scored in every inning except the 5th. The pitcher Viane collected 3 hits in 3 times at bat. Tom Webster had a triple and a single in 3 times at bat scoring 2 runs.

Wayne Johnston had 2 singles in 3 times at bat scoring 2 runs. Joe Himmelpach hit his first homer in 4th inning. Mike Perry and Mike Kearney and Chris Norton hit lone singles in the contest.

Friday, July 1, Jerry Turner stole the spotlight when he held Walled Lake hitless for 5-2/3 innings before giving up a lone single. Jerry struck out 15 Walled Lake batters and walked 5 as he coasted to a 10-0 win.

Farmington took an early lead in the 2nd inning jumping on Walled Lake's starting pitcher for 4 runs on singles run by Wayne Johnston, Tom Webster, a walk to Jerry Turner and back to back singles by Mike Perry and Myles Kearney.

In this contest also Farmington scored in every inning 5 wins - 1 loss that being a 1-0 game with Berkley when collecting 2 more hits, a double and a single and Al Kikka hitting his first Legion home run in the 6th inning with a man on base.

On Sunday, July 3, Farmington swept a double header

from Berkley by the scores of 8-0 and 2-0 with pitchers Chuck Viane and Rick Krumm each allowing 2 hits with Chuck striking out 17 and giving up no walks. Rick Krumm struck out 16 and gave up one walk.

In the first game Farmington took a 4-0 lead in the 3rd inning on walks to Mike Perry and Myles Kearney, a 2-2 tie hit by Chuck Viane, and Tom Webster's triple.

Farmington picked up 2 more runs in the 5th inning when Chuck Viane opened the home run over the fence by 325 ft. and back to back singles by Carl Misch and Tom Webster scoring 2 runs.

Farmington collected 2 more runs in the 8th inning capping the scoring on a double by Mike Kearney, a walk to Wayne Johnston and singles by Tom Webster and Jerry Tinkle.

In the 2nd game of the afternoon, the pitchers were locked in a no-hit duel after one out in the 5th inning, Mike Tinkle singled and moved to second when Misch belted a third with the throw coming to the plate.

Mike Kearney then singled sharply to left scoring both runs for a 2-0 victory. The other hit in the game was a walk to Jerry Turner.

The pitching staff has completed a record of 11 wins and 1 loss led by Chuck Viane 5 wins - 1 loss that being a 1-0 game with Berkley when collecting 2 more hits, a double and a single and Al Kikka hitting his first Legion home run in the 6th inning with a man on base.

## FARMINGTON TOWNSHIP PLANNING COMMISSION PUBLIC HEARING THURSDAY, JULY 28, 1966 8 P.M.

At Farmington Township Hall 31555 W. Eleven Mile Road

Persons who may be interested are invited to participate in discussion of the proposed change:

The following text change to the township zoning ordinance be considered during the public hearing as being recommended to the Township Board for its enactment as an ordinance amending the township zoning ordinance.

### ORDINANCE 25-H

An Ordinance enacted under Act 184, Public Acts of 1943, as amended, governing the unincorporated portions of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, to regulate and restrict the location and use of buildings, structures and land for trade, industry, residence and for public and semi-public or other specified uses; and to regulate and restrict the use of land to determine the size of yards, courts and open spaces; to regulate and limit the density of population; and for said purposes to divide the Township into districts and establish the boundaries thereof; providing for changes in the regulations, restrictions and boundaries of such districts; defining certain terms used herein; providing for enforcement; establishing a Board of Appeals; and imposing penalties for the violation of this Ordinance.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan:

### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO FARMINGTON TOWNSHIP ZONING ORDINANCE REGARDING CAR WASHES

- Amend Section 900 by deleting paragraph 5.
- Add to Section 902, the following new paragraph 6:  
6. Automobile Car Wash subject to the following:  
a. All buildings shall have a front yard set back of not less than twenty (20) feet.  
b. All washing facilities shall be within a completely enclosed building.  
c. Vacuuming and drying areas may be located outside the building but shall not be in the required front yard and shall not be closer than twenty-five (25) feet from any residential district.  
d. All cars required to wait for access to the facilities shall be provided space off the street right-of-way and parking shall be provided in accord with Section 1404.  
e. Ingress and egress points shall be located at least sixty (60) feet from the intersection of any two streets.  
f. All off-street parking and waiting areas shall be hard-surfaced and dust free.  
g. All lighting shall be shielded and directed away from adjacent residential districts.  
h. A four (4) foot completely obscuring wall shall be provided where abutting to a residential district.
- Add to Section 1404 Subsection 9 a new paragraph 28 as follows:  
a. Automatic Car Wash (not self-service)  
One (1) for each employee and reservoir parking space equal in number to five (5) times the maximum capacity of the auto wash. For purposes of determining reservoir parking needed, the greatest number possible of automobiles under going some phase of washing at the same time, which shall be determined by dividing the length in feet of each wash line by twenty (20), shall be considered maximum capacity.  
b. Self Service Car Wash (coin operated)  
Five (5) for each washing stall not including the space provided in the stall.
