

## Governor Romney To Be Keynote

Governor George Romney will keynote the Oakland County Republican fall convention August 17 at Southfield High School, Ten Mile and Laker Roads.

"The convention of the 18th and 19th congressional districts for the purpose of electing delegates and alternates to the state convention will begin at 8 p.m. followed by the convening of the county convention," stated Oakland County chairman Joseph R. Farinham. "The County convention will act on a report of the joint committee on resolutions and any other business of concern to both congressional districts. A total of 167 delegates and alternates will be sent to the state convention at Cobo Hall August 27. The number of delegate seats is allotted on the basis of the Republican vote for sec-

etary of state in the November 1964 general election. The 18th Congressional District will elect 112 delegates, and 55 will be elected from the Oakland County 19th Congressional district.

## Farmington Dems Detect Promise In Heavy Vote

Encouraged by the highest primary vote in history, Democratic candidates for Farmington Township offices have promised a vigorous "people to people" campaign aimed at replacing the present administration in the November general election.

Farmington Democratic Chairman Aldo Vagnozzi told the party's monthly meeting that the primary election results indicate that the Democratic candidates have a good chance to win this fall.

The party's candidates for office are: Vagnozzi for Supervisor, Elizabeth O'Connor for Clerk, Joyce Hungerford for Treasurer and Harris Berger and Harold Spiece for Trustees. Vagnozzi pointed out that fewer than half of the primary voters cast ballots for the present office holders. "The present Supervisor received only about 37% of all the votes cast for that office in the primary," Vagnozzi said, "indicating that about 63% would rather have someone else in that office."

"The same is true for the offices of Clerk, Treasurer and Trustees. We welcome the support of all Republicans, Independents and Democrats, who by their votes indicated that they want a new Township administration. There is room for all citizens to participate in our campaign."

Vagnozzi stressed the importance of electing all five Democratic candidates to give a new administration the votes on the Township Board needed to carry out improvements in traffic safety, building codes, health and other services. "Many people do not realize that the Township Clerk and Treasurer are voting members of the Township Board. The re-election of the present holders of those offices could

with the two holdover Trustees would keep control in the hands of the present administration regardless of the outcome of the other three races," Vagnozzi pointed out.

The program part of the meeting was taken up with a discussion of "The Future of Farmington - City and Township" Two councilmen of the City of Farmington were present at the meeting as observers. The Township, which was also invited to participate, did not send anyone.
