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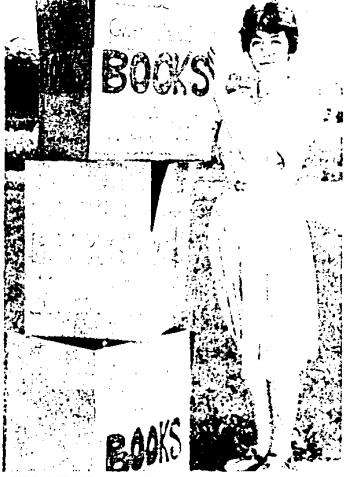

Art Show Climaxes 'Headstart'

A display of the free-wheeling art projects of preschool children enrolled in Farmington's Headstart program was on display with work from other school districts at the South Oakland Branch of the Office of Economic Opportunity in Royal Oak Township this past week.

The thirty students enrolled in the second year of the program just doubled the number served in 1965. Two classrooms met mornings at William Grace School for six weeks. Teachers Stephanie Ruiter and Donna Waskul were assisted by student aides Deborah Hampton and Christine McKeely.

The program is part of a nation-wide effort to give pre-schoolers who need it a richer cultural and conversational experience than they would get at home and thus launch them on a "head start" when their school experiences begin in kindergarten. In the program, teachers hope to cultivate a love for school and a readiness for a multitude of learning experiences. The Headstart Program is supported jointly by federal and local funds.
