"THE CENTER WILL be open to all senior citizens of the county, not just any particular group. There are 18,000 senior citizens in Oakland County," said Mrs. Ross, "and what we try to do is get them out of their isolation. Some," she continued, "live so remote from the mainstream that they can be ill or die without anyone even knowing about it. The center will fill a real need in our community," she concluded.

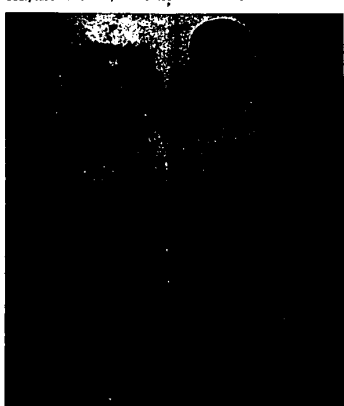
