Long-Time F'ton Resident In Anti-Poverty Post

A Farmington resident since 1919, Mrs. Eva Ross is among the 18 new members of the Oakland County Commission on Economic Opportunity (OCCOE). The Commission is responsible for coordinating and administering anti-poverty programs and services including the two Opportunity Centers in Royal Oak Township and Pontiac and the recently ended Summer Head Start program for preschool children in Farmington.

Mrs. Ross, who lives at 21401 Purdue, was named to the policy-making Commission through her membership on the Oakland County Senior Citizens' Advisory Council. The Council is one of three citizen councils formed this spring by the Commission as a means of giving greater voice and participation in anti-poverty programs to county residents.

Farmington Takes Prizes At The Fair
