As the sun sets Wednesday evening, September 14, congregants of Temple Beth Am along with Jews all the world over will gather to observe the Jewish New Year, Rosh Hashanah, one of the most ancient and sacred days in their history.

## Local Job's Daughters Earn State, World Honors

Job's Daughters of Farmington have once again collected honors for their Bethel, this time at both the State and World-wide conventions.  
At the June 29 to July 3 Grand Session held in Grand Rapids, a gathering of Job's Daughters from across the State of Michigan, Farmington Bethel No. 35 was presented three awards.
