Power Squadron To Offer Classes

Free classes in Navigation, Small Boat Handling and Safety at Sea will be offered to the public by the Dearborn Power Squadron. Registration will be held: Sept. 21, Wednesday, 7:30 p.m., Farmington High School, 32500 Shiawassee, Farmington; and Sept. 27, Tuesday, 7:30 p.m., Whittier Jr. High School, 18500 Ann Arbor Trail, Livonia.

Barret N. Stimpson of 111 Golfview Lane, Ann Arbor, is Commander of the Dearborn Power Squadron which is one of 358 local squadrons, each a unit of the United States Power Squadron. This National, non-profit civilian educational organization, has dedicated fifty years to increasing safety at sea through a program of nautical education for boatmen and prospective boatmen. All instructors are members of the Squadron and serve without pay. Candidates for membership are selected from among Piloting Class students who pass the course.

The course consists of ten weekly lectures. Subjects covered include rules of the nautical road, equipment required by laws, seamanship, the compass chart work. An examination concludes the course. Classes are open to men and women, regardless of whether or not they own a boat.

Total membership in the U.S.P.S. is over 65,000. Squadrons are located in the United States, Hawaii, Alaska, Canal Zone, Okinawa, Puerto Rico and Japan. More than 35,000 men and women take the basic piloting course each year. Members may go on to further studies. The full program is a five-year course ending in Celestial Navigation.
