Big Brother Endeavor Seeks More Volunteers

Detroit Tigers Bill Freehan, Willie Horton and Dave Wickensham pinch-hit recently for Big Brothers of Oakland County when they provided tips for four boys awaiting assignment of Big Brothers by the United Fund agency. The boys learned about hitting, throwing and fielding a baseball — instruction they can't get at home because there's no father or Big Brother available to work with them.

More than 140 Big Brothers are currently active in Oakland County and almost 500 assignments have been made since the agency was incorporated in 1954. But numerous boys 8-15 years old and fatherless still await assignment. Some have been on the organization's case list since 1965. All pairings are in a one-man, one-boy basis, and are made after the volunteer Big Brother is specially chosen, screened and prepared for his particular assignment.

The purpose of the program is to provide the youngsters with a "therapy of friendship" and a model of manhood. In addition, Big Brothers of Oakland County has a caseworker assisting the Little Brother and his mother to understand their mutual problems. The length of the relationship between Big Brother and Little Brother varies from six months to several years.

Big Brother Ed Underwood of 1717 West Auburn, Rochester has had the same Little Brother for 6 years. Bob Gibson of 827 East Fifth, Royal Oak is assisting his fourth "one in 11 years. Dr. Charles L. Bowers, 3355 Franklin, Bloomfield Hills is the president of the board of directors.
