Falcons Raiders-Kettering Play Rout Hard-Fought Tie Rocks

Plymouth found that containing a promising Farmington sophomore was the real root of their problem if they were to win. They failed.

Doug Root, a 6 foot 2 inch 200 lb. fullback, came off the bench to score two touchdowns and lead the Farmington Falcons to a 20-0 rout over the Plymouth Rocks. Root, replacing injured Mike Simmons, gave indications that he could become important in Falcon football history as he hammered away for 96 yards in 19 carries. He also booted two extra points and boomed kickoffs into the enemy end zone.

Chris Norton electrified the home crowd early in the game. The senior speedster took a Plymouth punt at his own 40, headed for the sidelines, and outran everyone for the opening score. Root's perfect conversion made it 7-0.

Plymouth's offense was erratic and could not sustain a drive in the first half. After stopping the Rocks, Farmington began moving midway in the second quarter behind straight power running. But on a quick kick, disaster struck. Pile-driving Fritz Simmons, fullback and linebacker, lay on the field in agony with a back injury and was carried from the game.

John Sewell took over Simmons' linebacking chores on defense. But it was Root who took up the slack in the offense, plunging two yards for the score. The touchdown was set up by a Dan Wolfman to Paul Misch, the pass covering 35 yards. The score remained 14-0 at the end of the first half.

Root continued to plague the Plymouth defenders in the second half. After kicking off, he returned a Rock punt for 30 yards four plays later. Taking a third down screen pass from Ed Snyder, the talented transfer rambled 13 yards more. Several plays later, he capped the drive by blasting through a huge hole for his second touchdown of the day.

Coach Robert Mistle's exchanging offense switched from the tactics of the reckless riverboat gambler to a more conventional style. The Falcons were content to stay on the ground, attempting only four passes for three completions for 45 yards.

North Farmington Raiders battled to a tie with the Captains of Waterford Kettering Friday, Sept. 23, on the Raiders' home field.

North Farmington came on the field as inspired football team after losing their opener the preceding week. They received the opening kickoff and marched down the field against a stubborn Kettering defense. The drive featured crisp blocking by a small Raider line and hard running by the Raider backs. At 7:53, Tom Van Hoes capped the drive with a five yard run around left end to make it 6-0 for the Raiders.

On the following kickoff, Kettering fumbled and the Raiders once again had the ball, this on the Captains' own 30 yard line. Fine running by junior halfbacks, Chuck H111 and Gary Zerhan, brought the Raiders to pay dirt. Gary Zerhan plunged the final yard at 5:34 of the first quarter. Mark Faller booted the extra point and the Raiders led 13-0.

North Farmington controlled the ball the entire first half and had many chances to add to the score but failed to capitalize on them. At the half
