

## Coins Asked For UNICEF

On October 21, Farmington children will join more than 3.5 million American boys and girls in over 13,000 communities in "Trick or Treating for UNICEF."

They will be identified Halloween night by their official half-pint milk containers showing the UNICEF emblem of a mother and child on an orange background.

UNICEF stands for the United Nations Children's Fund. The award was given to the fund last fall for 20 years of life-saving work in more than 100 countries throughout the world.

No contribution is too small. One penny buys six cups of milk. A nickel cures two children of yaws. One dime saves a trachoma victim from blindness.

"Big treats" like 75 cents and \$1 cure a young victim of leprosy or provide home treatment for a tuberculosis patient for one year, respectively.

One dollar gives a daily glass of milk to 20 children for one month.

Created in 1946, UNICEF has fought against hunger and disease, misery and illiteracy in more than 500 long-range programs in over 100 developing countries. Its aid comes in the form of necessary supplies and equipment not available within the assisted country, and for the training of a national staff.

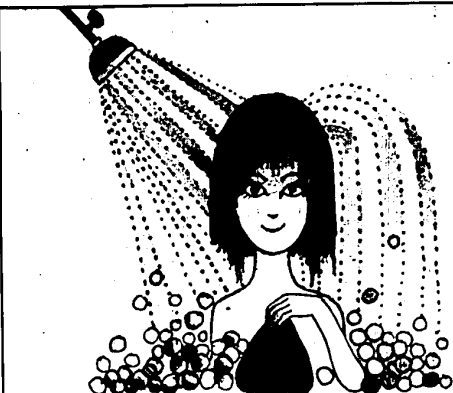

## Clarenceville Completes Study On Report Cards

Conferences for teachers and parents will be taking place in the Clarenceville schools next week. It is urged that parents make every attempt to attend at scheduled time. Bedford Elementary will hold conferences on October 24, Edgewood on the 25th, Grandview on the 26th and Westbrook on the 27th.

A committee consisting of members of the elementary faculty and parents have culminated a two year study concerned with how to report students' intellectual and social growth to the parents. Their study included examining and studying report forms used in other Michigan school districts, studying professional literature and research articles related to this topic, submitting questionnaires to parents and faculty, and drafting check list report forms which were used on an experimental basis for teacher-parent conferences for a period of one year. After completion of this study the following criteria were used in formulating an instrument for reporting pupil growth.

Does it indicate a child's level of progress in terms of his own capacities and abilities?

Does it consider the child as an individual, as well as a member of a social group?

Does it emphasize stimulating and guiding the child, rather than judging him?

Is it suitable to the age level for which it is made?

Does it tell more accurately and completely how the child's intellectual, social, physical, and emotional development is progressing?

Does it show each child's present level of growth and suggest possibility for future growth in all areas?

Needs to improve indicates that in the best judgment of the teacher, the child is capable of doing better work.

The form will also be used for scheduled parent teacher conferences, as well as the regular report card marking periods. Space for teacher comments is provided for written explanation and elaboration where needed.

This new report form will be used on a trial basis for one year. At the end of that time it will be evaluated and recommended changes for improvement will be considered.

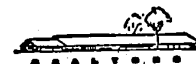

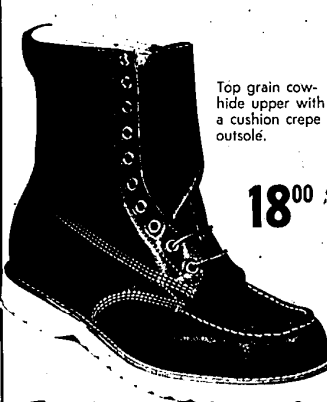
Adams is a sophomore civil engineering major.
