Enrollment Figures Reach New Heights

With the official enrollment figures now reported, Clarenceville School District has reached a new all time high in student population. The continuing growth in student body size is shown in all six schools. The new enrollment shows the high school with 838, Grandview with 785, Botsford with 770, Edgewood with 721, junior high with 543, and Westbrook with 197. These figures show a grand total of 3,854 students with 2,475 of them in the elementary schools, and 1,381 at the secondary level.

When reviewing the enrollments by grade level, one can see the largest enrollment in grades first, kindergarten, and second respectively. These figures indicate that future growth will continue upward and the days of a student body of 1000 plus in the high school are nearing.

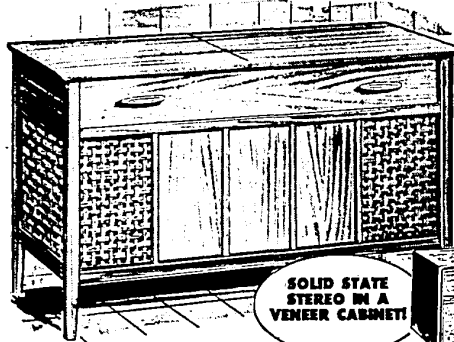
