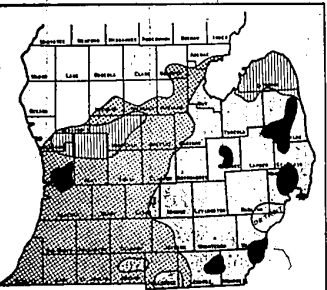

Understanding your HEALTH

I've heard some people say that "glue sniffing" by teenagers is a harmless, and non-habit forming practice. I couldn't disagree with this viewpoint. There is significant evidence that this is actually harmful to a young person—both physically and mentally.
The seriousness of this problem, I think, can be illustrated by actual cases involving glue sniffers. Tragically, some young people have been found suffocated, with their heads in a bag containing glue. Others have been involved in robberies, tried to fly from a low building, and exhibited other types of dangerous mental confusion.
NOW, JUST WHAT is the glue sniffing, and what do young folks expect to gain by it? Common method building glue is used for sniffing. A solvent in the glue produces the fumes that are deeply inhaled by the teenager. And analysis has shown many of these glues contain benzene, which could be a significant health hazard.
The usual method of glue sniffing is to squeeze a tube of glue into a handkerchief and hold it in front of the nose or mouth. However, more perceptive sniffers place the glue in a plastic bag to capture and concentrate more of the fumes. Other young people preheat the glue in an effort to increase the effect even more.
REASONS FOR GLUE sniffing are numerous. Juvenile workers and police tell us that youngsters engaged in the practice are usually contending with many difficulties. They have emotional and psychological problems, economic worries, and the problem of glue sniffing itself.
The actual dangers of sniffing are not yet completely known, but some authorities believe that irreversible damage to the brain and kidneys may result from excessive inhalation of glue fumes. Others feel it may actually damage the bone marrow of the teenager if the practice is engaged in long enough.
IN ADDITION, some persons have double vision, hallucinations, and fall into a coma and suffer convulsions after excessive sniffing. The fumes also seem to bring out a feeling of reckless abandon, and aggressive tendencies that endanger the glue sniffer and people around him.
What can be done about this problem? Well, we must correct the underlying emotional disorder of the individual teenager, who needs a release through sniffing. Progress is being made in this area, however, it may be many years before we have all the right answers. An important step to be taken, right now, is to educate parents, children, and school teachers about the health risks in glue sniffing.

1966 LOWER PENINSULA PHEASANT NUMBERS
Here, bird hunters, is how pheasant numbers stack up this fall for Lower Michigan's Oct. 20-Nov. 10 season on ring-necks: The categories from poor to best do not completely reflect hunting opportunities; they simply provide comparisons of pheasant populations from area to area. In other words, the "best" pheasant areas shown here are not necessarily spots where sportsmen will have field days in bagging birds. By the same token, some areas with lower ringneck numbers are not necessarily poor places for getting birds. Overall, pheasant numbers are down about 10 per cent from last year when some 684,000 of the birds were shot. Accounting for most of this is the 37-per cent drop in the Thumb area. The biggest pheasant slump has taken place in the tip of the Thumb area where the birds' populations have skidded to a poor level after being among the highest in the state only a relatively few years ago. Department game men trace a big reason for this to intensive "clean" farming which has destroyed large tracts of once-productive pheasant cover and food.

Need License
