william T. McGraw, Tourist Council director, said that Council did representatives had direct contact with more than 13,000 winter sports en-thusiasts at recent mid-west ski and vacation shows in Chi-eago and Cleveland, an in-crease of some 30 percen-over the same shows last year.

"This interest, coupled with early returns from our adver-tising and publicity programs, indicates continued high inter-est in Michigan as a winter vacation, destination," Mc-Graw said, "With favorable conditions for wither sports activity, we expect that the 180407 season will be a good one."

The Tourist Council estimates that some 259,000 persons will spend about 223 million to ski in Michigan th is winter compared to 210,000 persons and 321.5 million last vear. 


