Michigan Law

(This is a public service article explaining in general terms a provision of Michigan law. Individuals who wish to determine the effect of any law upon their private legal affairs should consult a private attorney.)

The Michigan one-man grand jury is the arsenal of law enforcement. The Attorney General has made good use of it to protect the Michigan public during the last few months. A portion of the Michigan Criminal Code provides for inquiry into alleged criminal activities by the grand jury when the court grants a petition of the Attorney General or prosecuting attorney who shows the court that there is probable cause to suspect the occurrence of a criminal offense. This law is a modernization of an ancient and honorable proceeding having its roots keep in the English common law.

The statute provides for the summoning of twelve persons, their attendance, for punishment of witnesses neglecting or refusing to answer questions, and for protection of the secrecy of the proceedings by obligating all persons involved in it to refrain from disclosing any portion thereof.

Secrecy of grand jury proceedings is further preserved by the requirement that the records of the grand jury be lodged with the Clerk of the Michigan Supreme Court, who seals and files them in a locked, separate container. When the investigation of the judge acting as one-man grand jury results in finding, on the evidence, that certain persons should be charged with crime, thereupon the grand jury may cause the arrest of such person or persons. Thereafter, the accused is dealt with according to criminal law including, of course, the right to a fair trial.

In a case holding that the one-man grand jury is a proper judicial proceeding, the Michigan Supreme Court has quoted the United States Supreme Court, to the effect that a proceeding before a grand jury constitutes "a judicial inquiry of the most ancient lineage."

It is a strong sentiment upon the ramparts of liberty.
