## NF Boys, Girls Gym Teams Win

"Next, the boys and girls will tumble together . . . alternately" was the hit of the Gymnastics meet Saturday, when the North Farmington Gymnasts competed against Hillsdale High School before a crowd of about 350 people.

The boys' team came through with a smashing victory of 97 to 31, while the girls also won with a score of 59 1/2 to 33.

First and second scores were taken in all but one event by N.F., and all but one third place. First place winners were Gary Palmer, junior, with a total score of 147.5 in vaulting; Tom McArt, junior, in free exercise with 151 points; Ray Smith, a senior with an average score of 62.5 on the horizontal bar; on the parallel bars, Gary Palmer, scoring 75.3; senior Tom Windberry with 69 on the side horse; Pat Beattie, senior, on the still rings scoring 72.5; and Tom McArt in tumbling with a score of 77.5, and a first on the trampoline by Tom Proctor with 70.5.

Sophomores are working hard this year. Out of the four that performed, three took one of the first four places in their event. Terry Boys took a third in vaulting, Buzz Overfield walked away with a second place on the parallel bars, and Mark Kujawa took a third place ranking on the side horse; all three gave outstanding performances.

It looks like coach Dick Shilling has another first place team again this year.

Miss Mary Feller's girl gymnasts also gave outstanding performances.
