The principal item on the agenda was the continued discussion of the proposed lower court re-organization bills to be submitted to the legislature early in the 1967 session. The new Michican constitution required the formation of a new lower court system to become effective by January 1, 1969.

Such a court system would

Such a court system would abrorb all of the 93 municipal courts in Michigan, all of the many justices of the peace, common pleas court of Detroit and the circuit court commissioners. The legislature is expected to enact the proposed legislation in final form in time to permit the judges of the proposed lower courts to ron for office in the general election of 1968.
