## Opera Star Now 'Salesman'

From law student to department store floor-walker... From opera troupe to a Broadway lead... Then to an advertising agency and work with the Farmington Players.

That's the profile of the career of George Britton, who will play the lead role of Willie Loman in Arthur Miller's "Death of a Salesman."

The play will run from Feb. 17-18 and 24-26 and March 3-4 in the Farmington Players' Barn at 12 Mile and Powers Road. Reservations may be made by calling 626-2533.

The play is directed by Nancy Harrower and the cast includes George Britton, Bessie Hannan, Bill Salisbury, Jim Blovits, Joel Hepper and many other local favorites.

BORN IN Chicago, George Britton grew up in Brooklyn and Long Island and was president and valedictorian of his high school graduating class.

He took a pre-law course at Columbia University, graduating at the depth of the depression, and was one of two students able to get jobs as floor-walkers at Macy's Department Store. (The other later went to Gimbel's and became head of the toy department.)

At Columbia, Britton had joined the glee club and appeared in several variety shows. He tried for, and won, a scholarship to the Juillard School of Music—and that led him to opera.

Britton went to Prague and made his opera debut in a cast that included his former Juillard colleague Rise Stevens. For two years, he toured the small opera houses of Europe.

But war clouds darkened, Austria was swallowed by Germany, and Britton caught the last ship out of Rotterdam before the war began in earnest.

HE TAUGHT at Juillard for several years, but in summer he worked the opera circuit across the country in such shows as "Student

Prince," "Blossom Time," "Roberta," "Chocolate Soldier" and "Annie Get Your Gun."

In 1946, while doing several shows with the Los Angeles Civic Light Opera, he met a

young ingenue named Kaye Connor, a professional show-biz girl (radio and movies) since the age of five.

They joined a touring company of "Gypsy Lady" which took them to England. On

Oct. 2, 1947, they were married.

BRITTON'S BIGGEST role came in 1952. Ezio Pinza left the Broadway production of "South Pacific," and Britton took over the lead role of Emile DeBeque until the show closed two years later.

He was a family man by then. He decided that the big roles would be too few and far between and the theater too precarious a way to make a living. So he left the theater.

The Brittons now have three children — Bonnie, 16, last year's Miss Junior Miss of Michigan and now a University of Michigan Freshman; Jon, 17, who will start work soon at the New Horizons workshop in Farmington; and Sari, 10, a fifth grader in Alma School.

He joined Cadillac in New York until Wilding, Inc., an advertising agency, hired him and six other former actors to tour the country in a Ford personnel training program.

Britton is now an account supervisor with Wilding in Detroit, and the family moved to Briar Hill Subdivision here in 1961.

WIFE KAYE was responsible for their joining the Farmington Players.
