City Receives Highway Funds

LANSING—The State Highway Commission announced today that it has started distributing fourth quarter Motor Vehicle Highway Fund collections to Michigan counties, cities and villages.

State Highway Director Howard E. Hill said Oakland County's share totaled \$1,358,518 while the City of Farmington received \$13,671.

All state gasoline and diesel fuel taxes and license plate fees go to the Motor Vehicle Highway Fund.

After deduction of collection costs and the Motor Vehicle Highway Commission's share, the money is distributed with 47 percent to the Department of State Highways, 35 percent to the State's 83 counties, and 18 percent to the 522 incorporated cities and villages.
