

McDonald Answer To 'War On Crime'

Instead of a "war on crime" as proposed by President Johnson, Congressman Jack McDonald will back an alternative to both the administration's aid programs and the "tax sharing" plan supported by many Republicans.

The 19th District GOP congressman said he favors a "tax retention" plan whereby the individual taxpayer would get credits against his federal income tax for state taxes that he pays.

Purpose would be to encourage states to handle their own problems and finances rather than turning to Washington for help.

THE SUBJECT came up last week when the Enterprise asked the former Redford Township supervisor his views on President Johnson's proposed "war on crime" — specifically, the portion about new federal aid programs to local law enforcement programs.

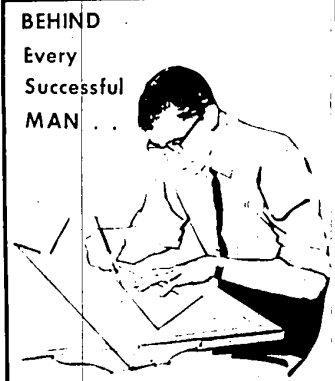

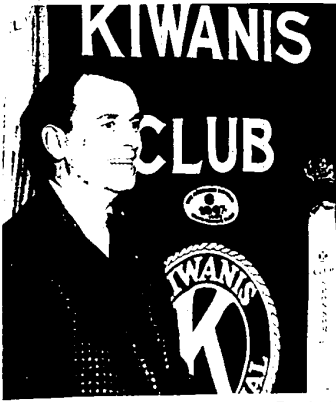
