Portray Judas
In His Treason

Pastor Charles Fox, of St. John American Lutheran Church, and the pastors of four other ALC churches in the Wayne Conference, have joined in an effort to dramatize the meaning of Lent by dramatic presentations of the important characters connected with Jesus.

At 8 p.m. March 1, Mr. Fox will deliver a monologue in his role as Judas Iscariot. Excerpts from the monologue include these remarks: "The world has always wondered what made me (Judas) betray and sell out the Son of God for thirty pieces of silver. Let's say I was a practical man. I was willing to go along with this idea that Jesus was the long-awaited Messiah as long as there was something in it for me.

"There were times, however, when I almost believed in Him. Remember when he raised Lazarus from the dead? I was truly impressed.

"When Jesus began talking more and more about his coming death, I thought that the scheme had been drained for about all its good. Now was as good a time as any to leave the organization. But my practical nature asked, 'How can I get out of this with a profit?'

"Now, don't get me wrong. I did not think Jesus was a fraud. I was around him enough to know that he had given all of himself in devotion and kindness to all people, and asked nothing for himself. I thought he was just another misguided religious fanatic."

"For three years I was in the very presence of God's son and yet I ignored the greatest opportunity of my life."

Slants Life

ANN ARBOR—Many a student away at college finds that the midnight "bull session" stirs up philosophical debates that could determine his entire life.

"The forceful influence of the peer-group has long been recognized and indeed has been the subject of much research," says Lloyd W. Putnam, educational director in the University of Michigan Office of Religious Affairs.

"For better or worse, the peer-group exerts a powerful conditioning effect. It plays a significant role in the actual education of students, in spite of the great temptation to think of education primarily in formal ways - classes, books, and professors."

Hugh V. Stewart has been called by the church development committee of the Presbytery of Detroit to begin the new Presbyterian parish in North Farmington - West Bloomfield.

Mr. Stewart comes to metropolitan Detroit from the Bryn Mawr Presbyterian Church in suburban Philadelphia, where he was ordained in 1963 and served as minister with youth.

He completed his graduate work in theology at Union Seminary in New York City and received his degree from McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago. During seminary he served as student assistant at churches in suburban Kansas City and Chicago.

A native of Amsterdam, N.Y., he served in the U.S. Army in Germany and was awarded the Bachelor of Arts degree in American History by the University of Arizona. Prior to entering McCormick he was employed in Tucson, Arizona as a television announcer and then as a management trainee with an Arizona bank.

Mr. Stewart and his wife Patricia live at 35305 Edythe Drive.
