

Seek \$8,000 For Youth Work

Farmington residents are being asked this week to set up an \$8,000 fund for a pilot athletic program. "To help combat the rising crime rate resulting from juvenile delinquency."

Making the appeal is the rejuvenated Citizens Youth Guidance Committee of Greater Farmington.

The committee recently began writing to business and professional men. This week, a mailing is going to residents.

Underlining the need for youth programs, the committee's letter cites a nearly 100 per cent increase in vandalism from 1962-63 and a 15 per cent increase in thefts.

Financial chairman Don Dames hopes for minimum contributions of \$10 each, although any gift will be welcomed.

Currently, the Youth Guidance Committee has a budget of less than \$2,000 a year to pay its own operating expenses.

WITH THE \$8,000 athletic fund, Dames said, the group could embark on such programs as these:

- After-school basketball programs in six elementary schools. Total cost of hiring the supervisors for two hours an afternoon, three days a week for 20 weeks: \$2,400.
- Some 25 to 40 youngsters could be accommodated. An existing program in one school has proven highly popular, Dames said.
- A similar evening basketball program for slightly older boys at another \$2,400.

• A shelter at each of three ice skating rinks at a total "guesstimated" cost of \$2,400.

Purpose of the shelters would be to encourage more frequent and longer use of the rinks.

• Formation of a Boys Club of Farmington.

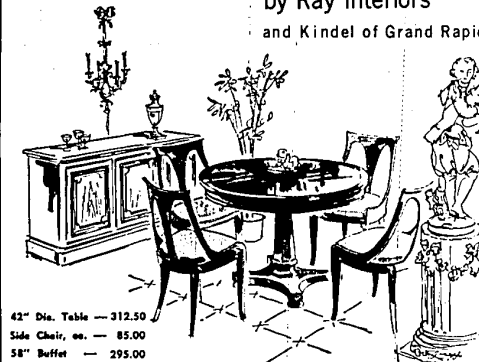
