Howard Kaiser of a Southfield karate school described the art of Korean karate as several of his students demonstrated the various techniques.

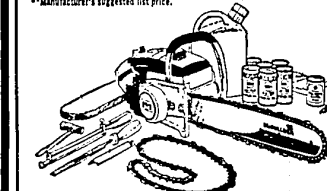
