2 Day Ballet Seminar By John Kriza

Internationally famous John Kriza, Assistant to the Directors of the American Ballet Theater, will be in Birmingham March 11 and 12 to conduct a two-day seminar for the Children's Ballet Theater. Kriza, who has been acclaimed the finest actor-dancer in ballet today, has been personally congratulated by a dozen or more heads of state including Queen Elizabeth at the Covent Garden Opera House, Chairman Nikita Khrushchev after the performance of "Bluebeard" in Moscow, and President John F. Kennedy following the performance of "Billy the Kid" in the White House. He has gained world-wide fame not only for his role in "Billy the Kid" but for his roles in "Fancy Free," "Rodeo" and "Fall River Legend."

His two-day seminar here will be held at the Birmingham Community House beginning Saturday, March 11 at 10 a.m. and Sunday, March 12 at 1 p.m. with each session lasting about four hours. He will conduct two ballet classes and two character classes.
