

Letter Describes Carrier Fire

March Reader's Digest carries an all-too-true yarn entitled "Fire on the Line at a Deck".

Tom Green, 20 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Leonard J. Green of 36408, Paddock, was on duty aboard the USS Oriskany when the fire broke out. He wrote about it to his family on the following day.

The Digest story begins: "On battle station off North Vietnam last October 26, the 43,000-ton U.S. aircraft carrier Oriskany was put in mortal danger when a magnesium flare exploded on her hangar deck. The fire spread to other flares and then to the path laid rockets and bombs of all sizes.

"If the bombs had gone off," said an officer aboard the ship.

"Amid choking clouds of acid white smoke which swirled down through the forced draft of the ship and suffocated those trapped there, brave crews reached the bombs and heaved them over the side. But, in less than three hours, 44 men died. Those who survived were throwing tales to tell of endurance, luck and heroism."

Tom's letter home, dated October 27, read:

"Hi Everyone, "Well, I thought I had better write 'cause I think you guys have heard the news about the disaster we had yesterday. Really most of my buddies are dead and I'm awfully lucky to be writing home saying we're OK. When the explosion took place we were in the middle of a magazine that the flares were in."

hatch there was because of the heat which was the hottest I ever felt.

"We made a mistake going below decks but it was the only way out unless running through flames. The lights were out and the smoke was terrible. Luckily, again, we didn't have far to go until we were to the ladder that goes up to the flight deck.

"On the flight deck we manned our general quarters stations. Mine was about the worst job of all. I was attached to the stretcher detail. I don't think I'll ever forget the awful sights of the dead we carried out of compartments.

"The rest is too sickening to talk about.

"The fire was out of control for about six hours, and when it was finally put out, it was a great relief to everyone. The results are as follows: There were 43 men that were killed and a lot more were injured. The whole front of the ship is a complete loss.

"We can't even launch aircraft because our steam receivers on the catapult are wrecked. We have a hole in the side of the ship, and they haven't even begun to look for damage in the compartments that are still flooded.

"Well, right now we're making for the Philippines as fast as the ship can go. I think we're supposed to be there at 18 in the morning tomorrow. I don't know how long we'll be there or where we're going from there, but I'll let you know.

"I'm going to go now 'cause I'm so tired. Been up nearly three days. Don't worry. Love to all,

Tom"

the Oriskany as a letter dated Feb. 12 told of two more fires aboard with no one injured but damage in the hangar deck and sand dollar bracket. Then "three of the guys" were killed in a crane accident.

The ship was subsequently placed in drydock in San Francisco, and was due to make her qualifying voyage on March 23. According to another of Tom's letters, it will leave on June 8 and be gone from nine months to a year. It will then be taken into the yards for a complete modernization.

Operation "Prairie" stretched from the shores of the South China Sea in the north to the western border of Cambodia in the south. It included assault forces, reconnaissance patrols and penetrating surveillance. The forces of "Prairie" killed nearly 1,400 enemy soldiers, and slowed enemy infiltration into South Vietnam from the north to a trickle.
