Schoolcraft To Orient Freshmen

A new freshman orientation program for June graduates of Schoolcraft College district high schools has been announced by Dean of Students Edward V. McNally.

Starting June 19 and continuing through July 20, approximately 1,400 June graduates who have already been accepted for entrance at the college in the fall, will keep appointments for a one-day orientation and counseling session on campus.

USING THE small-group technique, college counselors, each assisted by a sophomore student, will meet with 10 to 12 incoming freshmen in the day-long sessions. McNally said scheduling calls for a maximum of 60 freshmen on campus each day.

For new students who have graduated from high school prior to June, McNally said, a series of evening orientation sessions have been scheduled during May and June. These sessions, he said, will accommodate nearly 700 additional new students.

THE DAILY SESSIONS for June graduates will include a tour of the campus, a stop-off for I.D. card photographs, an individual counseling period, and a general orientation, question-answer session on the small group basis.

"We are also planning a follow-up orientation session several weeks after college opens when the freshmen have had an opportunity to get settled in their new surroundings," McNally explained.

"We feel this new approach will greatly improve our service to the new student and make him feel more at home and at ease on campus," McNally said.
