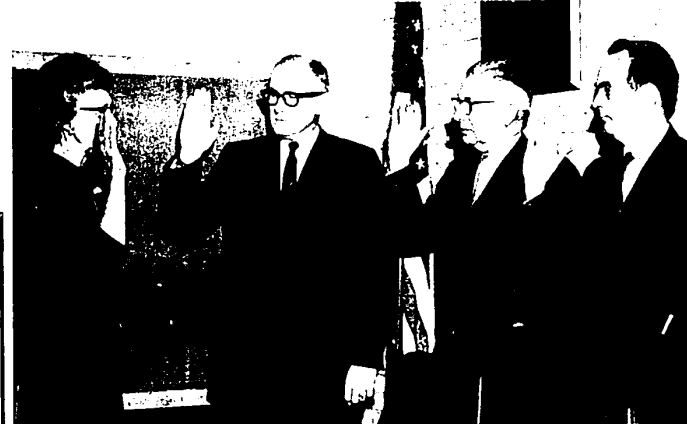

City Fire Marshal Outstanding

Jay Harrison, the City of Farmington's fire marshal, has been singled out by the Michigan Heart Association for his work in first aid mouth to mouth resuscitation and heart lung resuscitation programs in the community.

The association thought so much of his work that it wrote to Farmington City Council about Sgt. Harrison's "outstanding work."

During 1966, Sgt. Harrison conducted 22 programs and has already conducted 14 since the beginning of 1967.

Farmington's Director of Public Safety Robert F. Deady told the Council that Sgt. Harrison had conducted the program in hospitals and schools.

It was through the use of this technique that Sgt. Harrison saved the life of David Halpat, 14, of 31685 Folkstone Drive, on Jan. 8.

Changes Delay Eagle Sidewalk

Some contract changes are holding up construction of a sidewalk along 14 Mile Road from Eagle Elementary School to Coach Lane.

West Bloomfield Township, which is in charge of the project, is in the process of making some contract revisions with low bidder Pacific Cement Co. of Detroit, according to Clerk Doris Leach.

Mrs. Leach said the township's engineer has sent a sketch to the Oakland County Road Commission, which must make out the area.

Once the staking and contract signing are completed, the work can start whenever the contractor can schedule it.

The sidewalk will be 17.54 feet long, five feet wide and four inches thick and cost about \$4,000.

Meanwhile, residents of three Farmington Township subdivisions, whose children must walk along 14 Mile to reach Eagle School, are becoming restless.

They had been under the impression the work would be done last November.

Residents of Kimberly North, Briarcliff and Franklin Knolls subdivisions put up \$2,000, Farmington Township added \$1,000 and West Bloomfield \$1,000.

Cassell Enters Judo Contest

Board Passes Car Wash Rules

Coin-operated, self-service car washes would have to be enclosed buildings with ample setbacks from streets and intersections, under a new zoning ordinance adopted Monday by the Farmington Township Board.

The ordinance was subject of a Township Planning Commission public hearing last July 28, but reportedly was lost in the shuffle of County Zoning Coordinating Committee work for several months before reaching the Township Board.

The ordinance allows coin-operated car washes must:

- Be located in fully enclosed buildings.
- Have front yard setbacks of at least 20 feet.
- Have off-street parking space for five cars for each stall; parking areas would have to be hard-surfaced.
- Have a four-foot-high obstruction wall where the property abuts a residential area.
- Have its entrance and exit points at least 60 feet from any intersection.

Twp. Studies Conditions On 12 Mile

Hauling of dirt on 12 Mile Road twice occupied the attention of the Farmington Township Board Monday night. Trustee Earl Oppenheuser complained that truck tires are carrying mud from apartment projects onto 12 Mile between the Kendallwood subdivisions and Orchard Lake Road.

Cars are being damaged, and a driving hazard can result when rain turns clay on the road to a slippery veneer, he and other trustees complained.

Can an ordinance preventing it — or requiring contractors to clean the street at the end of a working day — be passed?

No, replied Supervisor Curtis Hall, and Township attorney J. T. Brennan added that the situation seems "almost uncontrollable."

Earlier in the meeting, the board granted a sand removal permit to Hopewell Development Co. so that it may level a sand knoll along 12 Mile between Halsted and Haggerty roads.

The site is its contemplated Farmington Meadows Subdivision.

The sand would be hauled west along 13 Mile, south on Haggerty, and east on 12 Mile to the Oakland Community College's Orchard Ridge campus at Farmington Road, where it would be used for fill.

ORDINANCE 23-I

An ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 29 of the Township of Farmington, entitled:

"An Ordinance enacted under Act 184, Public Acts of 1943, as amended, governing the unincorporated portions of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, to regulate and restrict the location and use of buildings, structures and land for trade, industry, residence and for public and semi-public or other specified uses; and to regulate and other structures; to regulate and to determine the size of yards, courts and open spaces; to regulate and limit the density of population; and for such other purposes to divide the Township into districts and establishing the boundaries thereof; providing for changes in the regulations, restrictions and boundaries of such districts; defining certain terms used herein; providing for enforcement; establishing a Board of Appeals; and imposing penalties for the violation of this Ordinance."

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO FARMINGTON TOWNSHIP ZONING ORDINANCE REGARDING CAR WASHES

1. Amend Section 900 by deleting paragraph 5.
2. Add to Section 902, the following new paragraph 6:
6. Automobile Car Wash subject to the following:
a. All buildings shall have a front yard set back of not less than twenty (20) feet.
b. All washing facilities shall be within a completely enclosed building.
c. Vacuuming and drying areas may be located outside the building but shall not be in the required front yard and shall not be closer than twenty-five (25) feet from any residential district.
d. All cars required to wait for access to the facilities shall be provided space off the street right-of-way and parking shall be provided in accordance with Section 1404.
3. Amend Section 1404 Subsection 9 a new paragraph 23 as follows:
a. Automatic Car Wash (not self-service)
One (1) for each employee and reservoir parking space equal in number to five (5) times the maximum capacity of the automatic car wash. For purpose of determining reservoir parking needed, the greatest number possible of automobiles under going same phase of washing at the same time, which shall be determined by dividing the length in feet of each wash line by twenty (20), shall be considered maximum capacity.
b. Self Service Car Wash (coin operated)
Five (5) for each washing stall not including the space provided in the stall.

SECTION TWO.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect upon publication of the ordinance in the Farmington Enterprise, Farmington, Michigan.

SECTION FOUR.

This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, County of Oakland, State of Michigan, at a meeting thereof duly called and held on the 10th day of April, 1967, and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by law.
