ANN ARBOR—Obstetricians and gynecologists could cope with the increasing demands for their services if they would train non-physician associates to handle the routine care and education of pregnant women, according to Dr. J. Robert Willson of the University of Michigan Medical Center.

DR. WILLSON, chairman of the U-M Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, said physicians should devote more time to premarital examinations, to patients with physical and emotional problems and to preventive medicine. "They should spend considerably less time doing things which trained associates could perform as well as well."

"A trained obstetric associate could give diet and hygiene instructions, provide much of the routine prenatal care for normal women and counsel her on family health problems which arise during and after pregnancy," he said.

"This would permit the physician to devote more time to women with complicated pregnancies, those pregnant for the first time and to help more expectant mothers than he can at the present time."

TRAINING programs to develop obstetric associates are now practically non-existent, Dr. Willson noted. But he urged that appropriate classes be started in teaching hospitals where both doctors and nurses could participate in educating this new group of specialists.

He said the typical obstetrician today is strapped by time. "Prenatal care for most patients, particularly those who have had one child without difficulty, often is little more than a series of social visits with the doctor. Yet they prevent the obstetrician from seeing other women who may be encountering serious problems."

DR. WILLSON noted that too few doctors do adequate premarital examinations nor take this opportunity to counsel their patients on family planning and the other problems of family life.

"Too often gynecologists like myself are consulted by a recently married woman with congenital absence of the vagina. Only after attempting intercourse does she become aware of the absence, although almost all have consulted a physician for a premarital examination."

An important but difficult problem, reports Dr. Willson, will be that of educating the physician. He must be taught that the most important thing he has to offer his patients are his skills in diagnosing, treating abnormalities and in preventive services, not just routine check-ups.
