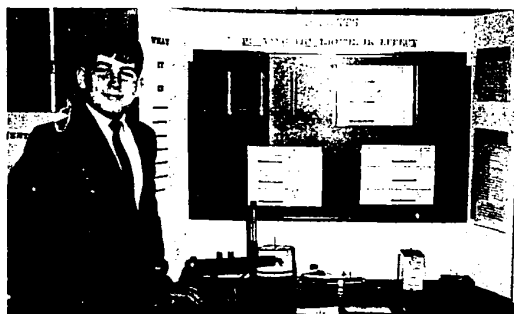
Six Pairs Win At Mayfair

Summer Diamond Hair Fashions

Evolved from the Diamond look of Spring, the Summer Diamond was inspired by the shape of a baseball diamond. From the front, the new hair style has the shape of a slender diamond with curved corners at the bases. Width in the coiffure flares out softly at the sides, just above the eyebrows, and tapers in again to a soft curve at the top. Essentially a small head look, it requires that hair be dressed close to the head near the face and at the nape.

Generally the Summer Diamond is an off-the-face look with hair brushed off the forehead for coolness and fashion... occasionally there is a small spiral curl or two over the forehead. Bangs modify the open-face look where hairlines or brows require.



Hair lengths for the Summer Diamond are short, approximately zero to one inch at the nape, 4 1/2 to 5 inches at the crown, 2 1/2 to 4 1/2 inches at the sides, and 3 1/2 to 4 1/2 inches at the front hairline. Hairpieces are used to transform the short hair styles from a sporty look to romantic elegance for evening.

Professional hair shaping is required for the new hair styles, and a custom permanent wave is important to give necessary softness and support to the hair.

Summer haircoloring calls for a triple play of tones of the same color to add highlights and soft depth.

Christine won with a project called "The Chicken Embryo." Her teacher is Mrs. Mary Hancuff.

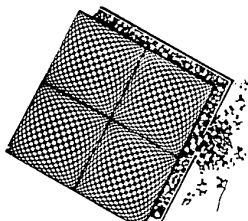
Donald's entry was "Rockets—Proving the Kruskal Effect." His teacher is Grant Wilcox.

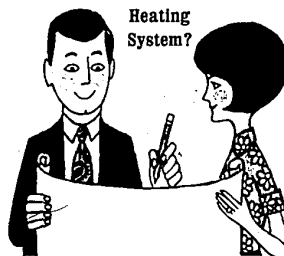
