

Child Guidance Clinic Seeks Funds to Continue

Northwestern Child Guidance Clinic does not want to close its doors. Members are asking a dire need in the community by assisting disturbed children recommended by the schools to become adjusted to their school and community.

The need is proven by the waiting list of young people waiting to be helped. The list is booking ahead 11 months.

All 16 communities involved in the Clinic, unfortunately do not financially support the program even though all benefit.

For every dollar of local funds spent the State matches an additional dollar. But because funds are not coming from all communities, there is a shortage.

In an effort to make up for this shortage the 27-man Clinic Board has come up with a fund raising project.

The election was conducted by the Political Science Club Senate election committee. Two voting machines loaned by Garden City were used in the day-long balloting.

The new Senate members took office on Oct. 5, joining eight sophomore members who were elected last spring.
