

Livonian Injured When Car Skids

William L. Clark, 32, of 12283 Hartel, Livonia, had an unexpected trip to Botsford General Hospital Oct. 23 after his car went out of control and turned over on Grand River Ave. just east of Tuck Rd. in Farmington Township.

According to witnesses the vehicle hit the right curb while pulling back in lane after passing a car and then rolled over on its side and skidded down the road crossing to the left curb and then back to the right, the police report states.

Clark was unable to provide a statement to the police because of his injuries. The police report that he was thrown outside the vehicle which finally stopped on its wheels.

The police in measuring all the skid marks came up with a total of 380 feet traveled by the car after the driver lost control.

O'Neil Feels Candidacy Submerged

James F. O'Neil, candidate for election again to the State Board of Education, has requested Governor Romney and the Legislative Leaders to amend the Constitution to provide for the election of the members of the State Board of Education, as well as the other state-wide educational posts, in the spring rather than at the general election in the fall and to take legislative action to provide for the election of these educational posts on a non-partisan basis.

O'Neil stated the election of these crucial educational posts is being submerged by the emotional, gubernatorial and other races. In addition, there is a general unawareness among voters regarding even the existence of these state-wide posts, as well as their crucial responsibilities, which include 50 percent of the total State budget.

O'Neil pointed to the results of two years ago when the member of one political

party were elected to all the educational posts. In the process, a former national president of the P.T.A. and a former President of the Michigan Education Association were overlooked by the voters, as well as a number of other very well-qualified candidates included in this group was Paul Hagwell, who had previously come within 20,000 voters of being elected Governor of Michigan.

O'Neil stated it is a tragedy in this day and age of mass education and mass communication that the masses of people are unaware of and the educational posts and their responsibilities or the candidates and their qualifications. He stated that it also was inconsistent to elect all the local Boards of Education on a non-partisan basis and elect the State-wide educational boards on a partisan basis.

O'Neil stated that by holding the election for these educational posts in the spring and electing them on a non-partisan basis, this very un-

Dems Promise 'Open Door' In Township

The neighborhood or sub-division association and citizens committees will play a key role in a Democratic administration for Farmington Township the party's candidates stressed at several meetings last week.

The candidates—Aldo Vagnozzi for supervisor, Elizabeth O'Connor for clerk, Joyce Hungerford for treasurer, Harris Berger and Harold Shippee for trustees, also stressed at these meetings that an open door policy would be adopted to give township residents a greater voice in their government.

Vagnozzi promised the Staman Acres Association that he and his running mates, if elected, would spend the time between Nov. 8 and the taking of office meeting with groups in the community to prepare the way for the new administration.

Vagnozzi was critical of the Township Supervisor's answer to the Staman Acres group that he couldn't do anything about road repairs because it was up to the County Road Commission which was an "autonomous" body.

"That word 'autonomous' bothers me," Vagnozzi said. "In the dictionary the word 'autonomous' comes too close to 'autocratic' I don't think that any appointed agency that is supposed to serve the people should be autonomous. Public officials are servants of the people, not their masters."

At a coffee hour meeting in the home of Mrs. Dorothy Williams, Berger was critical of the present members of the Township board for never disagreeing with each other on issues that they vote on.

Vagnozzi told members of the Stone Creek Association that the Democrats have been successful in piercing the wall of silence which their opponents tried to place around the Township election campaign. "This wall, like others tried throughout history, is crumbling and you are helping to bring it down by inviting me here this evening," Vagnozzi said.

In answer to a question about the value of experience on the county board of supervisors, Vagnozzi noted that the present Township Supervisor, despite his eight years in office, admits that he can't get the Road Commission to do anything about road repairs even though he is on the road committee that supervises the commission.
