

## Easter Seal Society Aids 538 Handicapped

The "Annual Service Report," now being distributed by the Easter Seal Society of Western Wayne County, describes services given between September 1, 1965, and August 31, 1966, to 326 physically handicapped children and 212 adults.

Over 4,450 contacts with these individuals or with others concerned with them provided rehabilitation services including: information, transportation, equipment loan or purchase, use of community or agency services, consultation and medical care. 164 children and adults attended club meetings, parties and Day Camp. Twenty-five multiple-handi-

capped teenagers had 3,124 days of special education classes at the Center.

The Easter Seal Society serves physically handicapped children and adults regardless of the cause of the disability whenever other agencies cannot assist.

Cerebral Palsy accounted for the largest single diagnostic group among those served this year. Hearing handicaps were the next most numerous because of the special Day Camp for children with communication problems held at the Center this summer.

## LIT Selected To Join U.S. Visitor Plan

The U.S. Department of State has designated Lawrence Institute of Technology an Exchange Visitor Program sponsor. It is announced by LIT President Wayne H. Buell.

He was notified by Paul S. Dwyer, chief of the State Department's facilities services staff of the bureau of educational and cultural affairs in Washington, D.C.

Dr. Buell said LIT has inaugurated the program with an offer of a scholarship to a national of British Honduras.

LIT is cooperating in what is officially described as:

"A program to provide courses of study, practical training, teaching, lecturing, research, or by combination thereof, in the various fields of instruction and research conducted by the Institute, for qualified foreign students, trainees, professors, and specialists to promote the general interests of international exchange."

LIT currently has enrolled 15 foreign nationals who entered with regular student visas. They represent Iraq, East Pakistan, Lebanon, India, Netherlands, Israel and Canada.
