

## French Singer To Appear at U of D

Three sell-out audiences in New York's Carnegie Hall early this month, and enthusiastic followings in Chicago, San Francisco, and Los Angeles, prepare Charles Aznavour, small, intensely serious, singer-composer, from Paris for his appearance on the University of Detroit Town and Garden Series, Sunday, Nov. 13.

Aznavor filled the Memorial Building at the U. of D. last season when Frankophiles flew in from Chicago and Montreal to hear him sing of tragedy and tenderness, with gaiety and glee at the human condition when love arrives.

He began writing sad songs for Edith Piaf 16 years ago, went on to singing and pro-

ducing his own shows, and became a top record-seller in his native France.

## Historymobile To Visit Farmington Nov. 8, 9, 10

The Michigan Historical Commission's Historymobile will visit Farmington Nov. 8, 9, and 10. Hours for the vehicle which will open up business in the Downtown Shopping Center in the City of Farmington, will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Admission is open to the general public free of charge. The Farmington Historical Society is sponsoring the unit's visit to the area.

The huge 10 foot by 34 foot museum on wheels will be located in the parking lot of the center. The center is located at Grand River and Farmington Rds.

Valued at more than \$50,000, the Historymobile was developed through the cooperation of 22 Michigan businesses and industries which contributed equipment and supplies.

A total of 18 colorful and informative displays have been prepared in a cooperative effort by 14 Michigan museums.

Displays are arranged chronologically. They cover topics such as prehistoric man in Michigan, French exploration and fur trade in the British era, Michigan becomes American, the territorial period, migration to Michigan, Michigan becomes a state, development of mineral resources, water transportation, railroad, transportation, the state's role in the Civil War, the white pine era, and the development of agriculture.

## Shakespeare Group Skates Performance at Oakland U.

When the National Shakespeare Company presents "Much Ado About Nothing" Saturday, Nov. 5, and "Hamlet" Monday Nov. 7, at Oakland University, the audience will be viewing a group making theatrical history. Both performances will be staged in the university's new 600 seat Wilson Hall at 8:30 p.m.

The National America's only cross country touring company, is the most widely traveled; Shakespeare group ever to travel this country. Last season alone it logged more than 35,000 miles in an eight month tour of 35 states during which it gave more than 300 performances. Its success reflects both the excellence of the 15 New York professionals, which make up its cast and the enduring

The company is the brain child of director Philip Meisler and producer Elaine Sulca, each with vast theatrical experience on both coasts. The 11 member cast was chosen from more than 3,000 applicants. Each actor plays a different role in the productions toured and must have resisted outside offers for other productions.

The lively, flexible company carries its own complete set of richly descriptive period costumes and scenery plus the most modern lighting and sound equipment available. Shakespeare becomes a vibrant and significant force as these dedicated actors present it.
