

## 37th Annual P.E.I. To Take Place Nov. 2

ANN ARBOR—The 37th annual Parent Education Institute, expected to attract parents and teachers from all across the state, will take place Wednesday (Nov. 2) at the University of Michigan.

The theme this year is "Better Lives for All Children," with the principal speakers to be an attorney, a psychiatrist, and a college president. The public is invited to attend sessions at the Rackham Building.

Attorney B. James George, Jr., professor of law at Michigan, will deliver the first address.

President David H. Pontitz of Washtenaw Community College will follow with a look at "What's Ahead Vocationally for Children."

The Institute will resume after lunch at Dr. Stuart M. Finch, chief of the U-M Children's Psychiatric Service, discusses "Coping with the Responsibilities of Parenthood."

A postscript will be delivered by Otto Yamaoka, director of the Division of Field Services at Western Michigan University.

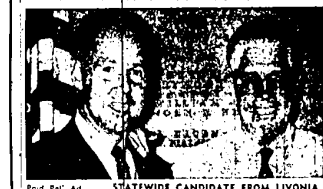
