Start Day With Good Breakfast

Children, like adults, perform better when fed an adequate breakfast. Now, that school is well under way and a child's performance is especially important to you, you would make sure your child doesn't skip the important meal, advises Patricia Morris, nutrition specialist with the Cooperative Extension Service at Michigan State University.

With an adequate breakfast your child will be able to perform better both mentally and physically.

This was documented by careful research studies a few years ago, and yet many children start the school day without breakfast. Dr. Morris says. Some teachers have reported as many as one-third of their pupils omit their morning meal.

Dr. Morris offers several suggestions for encouraging your child to eat breakfast. These are based on questionnaires given to school children.

A child will be most willing to eat breakfast if he is unburied in the morning. Getting to bed early enough to be ready to get up on time may be the answer.

Breakfasts that are interesting and varied are more enticing to young children. Instead of serving the same menu, use some of your child's favorite foods and alternate the meal pattern for interest.

Together, these are just as important as the morning meal as it is in the evening. Mrs. Morris says your child's breakfast will seem more important to him if he doesn't have to eat alone.

Like other meals, breakfast should be a time for interesting conversation. This means pleasant and happy emotional climate.
