What They Want

George Kuhn
As former mayor of Berkley and a candidate for State Senate, George W. Kuhn in-

dicated that if he is elected to the Senate, he would declare war on crime and violence in the streets of our cities.

"The citizens of Michigan are very disturbed and upset about the riots that have taken place in our cities recently," Kuhn said.

The former mayor stated that the protection of the general public and their safety is and must be our first and foremost concern as public officials.

To bring peace and to restore order in the streets of our cities as soon as possible, Kuhn indicated he will sponsor strong legislation to bring a halt to rioting and malicious destruction of both private and public property. He says there appears to be a vacuum in our state laws, and those groups or mass of individuals that engage in this activity escape arrest and prosecution, whereas, if any single individual is engaging in similar activities, the full measure of the law is applied. This is discrimination of the highest order.

"We must restore respect for law and order and give our police department adequate tools and laws to do their vital duty," Kuhn said. "The long range and ultimate answer," Kuhn said, "is that we must put new emphasis on prevention, including efforts to strengthen family life and individual responsibility."

Paul Livingston
Paul Livingston, candidate for the State Senate in the 14th District called for a new look at community hospital facilities at a recent meeting of the Michigan Council on Medical Costs.

As Secretary-Treasurer of the Council, Livingston promised that he would work to obtain hospital facilities for areas presently denied them because of the currently popular medical center concept. The candidate cited a lack of hospital facilities as the reason for a serious lack of doctors in 150 Michigan communities. To remedy this situation, Livingston developed a concept of "satellite" hospitals for smaller communities.

The need to travel long distances discourages doctors from locating in smaller communities. In addition, such satellites would make better use of nursing personnel. Livingston pointed out, in a state where 10,000 registered nurses and 8,000 licensed practical nurses are needed. Many non-practicing nurses might be encouraged to take up their professions again, because of this measure.

"The small 60 to 80 bed hospital in a small community can be an efficient and worthwhile institution," said Livingston, "providing essential services to their communities."

Charles Hicks Dies At 26

Funeral services for Charles Hicks were held from Caldwell Funeral Home Oct. 31 and at the Bethel Missionary Assembly of God Church in Livonia with Rev. Traub officiating. Interment was in Parkview Memorial Cemetery.

The 26-year-old father had the financial assistance and prayers of many residents after it was brought to the attention of many citizens of the plight of the young Livonia family.

Young Hicks was unable to work for many months. Generous Livonians opened their hearts and started a fund to assist them with their bills. He lived with the aid of a mechanical kidney. After a month of building him up, a kidney transplant was performed. His father, Vernon Hicks of Farmington, supplied the healthy kidney for the operation and was progressing, however, infection set in and he died Friday, Oct. 28.

Hicks was born July 3, 1940 and lived in this area all of his life, the past four years in Livonia. He was employed as a diesel fitter.

Surviving are his wife, Sharon, two daughters, Kimberly Sue and Kelly Marie, and one son, Thomas Charles. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Vernon Hicks of Farmington; one sister, Mrs. Charles Frederick of Galveston, Ind.; and four brothers, Curtis of Warren; Donald, of Garden City; Kenneth and Michael, both of Farmington.

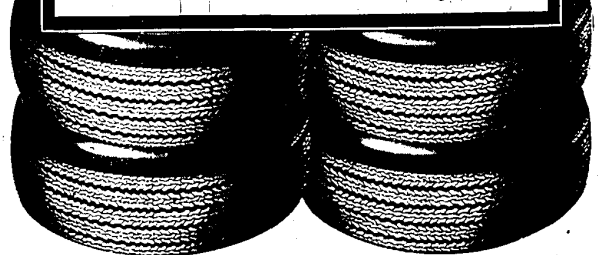
