

## Labor Expert Says Train for Tomorrow

Educational institutions must prepare their students for tomorrow, not yesterday, Dr. John P. Walsh, assistant manpower administrator for the U. S. Department of Labor, warned educators and business and industry leaders at a meeting at Oakland Community College recently.

Addressing a meeting of the OCC Career Program Advisory Council, Walsh, who was introduced by Congressman Billie S. Farnam, stated that of the 35,000 job titles listed by the Department of Labor as "critical," 8,800 are brand new occupations which did not even exist 10 years ago.

Of the 76 million in the nation's civilian work force, 2.8 million are unemployed, Walsh stated.

"The significant statistic," Walsh said, "is that job openings in fields requiring technical skills exceed the 2.5 million who are presently unemployed. If we as a nation are to keep pace with the emerging technology, educational institutions must deal with the elevating of the occupational capabilities of people."

"The non-skilled and the disadvantaged especially must be helped to obtain occupational skills," Walsh said.
